Dear Friend of Diane Trevarrow Evans,

Through the Wisconsin Architects Foundation, AIA Milwaukee has established a memorial fund in honor of Diane Trevarrow Evans, AIA, to celebrate her passion for the art/architecture profession. Diane was an architect, President of AIA Southeast Wisconsin/Milwaukee Chapter in 2006 and an officer of AIA Charlotte prior to relocating to Milwaukee. She also served on the AIA Wisconsin Board of Directors. Most recently, she was a member of the AIA Small Project Practitioners Knowledge Community and served as editor-in-chief of its national newsletter, an instructor at MIAD (Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design), Principal of Trevarrow Evans, and an avid supporter of "women in architecture."

Two and a half years ago, Diane initiated AIA Milwaukee's Diversity in Architecture Program. The program featured a keynote address by Charlotte's first African-American mayor, Harvey Gantt, AIA, principal of Gantt Huberman Architects. In September 2007 Diane envisioned and coordinated a keynote address by Mexico City architect Bernardo Gomez-Pimienta. Along with this presentation, a series of community outreach events included an exhibit highlighting work by area Latino architects and a presentation to students at the Advanced Language & Academic Studies High School, a predominantly Latino high school.

Similar to the two programs for which she was responsible, **AIA Milwaukee would like to honor Diane's contributions and dedication by hosting an annual program in her name. The program will promote dialogue and inspire the community, design professionals and future architects by showcasing the work of innovative, culturally diverse architects.**
